### How to use This Guide:

### Key Questions:

- Why do we struggle with sharing God's faithfulness? Think of a time God has been faithful in your life, and share it with the group. How does this help us prepare for the future?
- Have you been baptized? Share what you experienced. If not, then why not?
- How can you become more connected at Cornerstone with what God is doing. Is there a place where you would like to serve and get involved?

Your Relationship with God
